# **INTRODUCTION**

This matter was heard before me on June 21, 2023, at Regina, Saskatchewan.

I am satisfied there has been compliance with subsections 2-74(6), 2-75(2) and 2-75(3) of *The Employment Standards Act* (the 'Act'). Therefore, I have determined that I do have jurisdiction to hear this matter.

Lorne Deason, Employment Standards Officer's represented the Department of Employment Standards.

Complainant/Employee, Brittany Heisler, attended by telephone and represented herself.

Paul Clemens, Barrister and Solicitor represented the Appellant/Employer, Saskatchewan Health Authority.

The Wage Assessment was prepared pursuant to the Saskatchewan Employment Act s.s.2014 c.s-15.1, herein after referred to as "The Act" is for \$8,262.75.

# I. PRELIMINARY MATTERS

None of the parties had objections.

Mr. Clemens advised that there had been a settlement reached between the Saskatchewan Health Authority and Ms. Heisler.

The Employer had agreed to pay Ms. Heisler the full amount of the Wage Assessment being, \$8,262.75. The funds had already been advanced to Ms. Heisler in accordance with Employer Exhibit "1", setting out the withholding amount for Employment Insurance, Canada Pension Plan and Income Tax.

Ms. Heisler was in agreement with the deductions and payments and acknowledged receipt of \$4,968.77.

# II. CONCLUSION,

The Appeal is dismissed, and the Wage Assessment is confirmed in the amount of \$8,262.75.

# Right to appeal adjudicator's decision to board

- **4-8**(1) An Employer, Employee or corporate director who is directly affected by a decision of an adjudicator on an appeal or hearing pursuant to Part II may appeal the decision to the board on a question of law.
  - (3) A person who intends to appeal pursuant to this section shall:
    - (a) file a notice of appeal with the board within 15 business days after the date of service of the decision of the adjudicator: and
    - (b) serve the notice of appeal on all persons mentioned in clause 4-4(1)(b) who received the notice setting the appeal or hearing.
  - (4) The record of an appeal is to consist of the following:
    - (a) in the case of an appeal pursuant to Part II, the wage assessment, or the notice of hearing.
    - (c) the notice of appeal filed with the director of employment standards pursuant to Part II.
    - (d) any exhibits filed before the adjudicator.
    - (e) the written decision of the adjudicator.
    - (f) the notice of appeal to the board.
    - (g) any other material that the board may require to properly consider the appeal.
  - (5) The commencement of an appeal pursuant to this section does not stay the effect of the decision or order being appealed unless the board orders otherwise.
  - (6) The board may:
    - (a) affirm, amend, or cancel the decision or order of the adjudicator; or
    - (b) remit the matter back to the adjudicator for amendment of the adjudicator's decision or order with any directions that the board

### **Appeal to Court of Appeal**

- **4-9**(1) With leave of a judge of the Court of Appeal, an appeal may be made to the Court of Appeal from a decision of the board pursuant to section 4-8 on a question of law.
  - (2) A person, including the director of employment standards, intending to make an appeal to the Court of Appeal shall apply for leave to appeal within 15 business days after the date of service of the decision of the board.
  - (3) Unless a judge of the Court of Appeal orders otherwise, an appeal to the Court of Appeal does not stay the effect of the decision being appealed.

## Right of director to appeal

- **4-10** The director of employment standards has the right:
  - (a) to appear and make representations on:
    - (i) any appeal or hearing heard by an adjudicator; and
    - (ii) any appeal of an adjudicator's decision before the board or the Court of Appeal; and
    - (b) to appeal any decision of an adjudicator or the board.
